I attended the Campout and Activities subcommittees as well as the Unity Day subcommittee, Multi-Area Ad Hoc meeting, and Sponsorship event last month.

NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS WORLD SERVICE (NAWS) NEWS

- --CAR WORKSHOPS: We held our CAR Workshop on March 4th, approx 50 members came and went throughout the day. 17 members participated in voting on the motions. The RCM's from American River, SacFNA and Sierra Foothills all joined together to plan and facilitate the workshop. It was a pleasure to Co-host and work with the SacFNA and a big thank you to Gabe, Sheila and Heather from ARANA for providing lunch for everyone. However, it was concerning that our Regional Delegate (who facilitated the workshop) did not have any onsite support from the RSC and seemed to struggle somewhat. It was a rather difficult task for any one trusted servant to be asked to facilitate, host zoom attendees, orchestrate slide presentations, and tally votes....all while standing at a podium for 5 hours straight with minimal breaks. We did include our concerns last month in our RSC report, and it was discussed at length among the RCM's
- --Sadly, only 140 individual votes (representing all of the Northern California Region) were submitted for the World Conference motions during the 7 CAR Workshops. That's an estimated .005% of the members who attend the 1305 registered meetings throughout the Region.
- --RSC TRUSTED SERVANTS: We are in desperate need of Trusted Servant support at the RSC. We currently only have 4 out of 10 positions filled, and in June, 3 of those will term out. Our Vice-Chair is doing the job of 3 positions since we have been without a treasurer and secretary for a year now. In June we hope to elect a Chair, Vice-Chair, Delegate, alt-Delegate, Treasurer, Alt-Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Regional Resource Coordinator, PR and H&I Chairs. Every year NAWS publishes an annual report. It includes a complete financial report, and a written summary of projects NAWS addressed throughout the year. There's a great deal of information included in this report....so each month we will attempt to bring a small section of the report so it can be discussed.

When the pandemic hit, meetings shut down and literature sales dried up immediately. NAWS nearly experienced a catastrophic collapse. At its worst point, the majority of special workers had been laid off, and we only had enough operating funds to cover 37 days and then the doors were going to close. On 4/2020 and 2/2021, NAWS entered into loan agreements for \$676,740 and \$517,150, under the Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP").

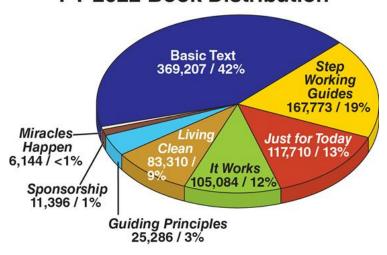
At the time, there were many members that expressed concerns about NAWS actions being in conflict with our 'self supporting' Tradition.

Background: The PPP, established as part of the CARES Act, provided loans for qualifying businesses for certain expenses, including payroll costs, continuation of group health care benefits, rent, utilities, and interest on certain other debt obligations. The loans bear interest at a rate of 1.0% per annum and mature 4/2022 and 2/2026. The loans could be forgivable under some circumstances, after an application was submitted.

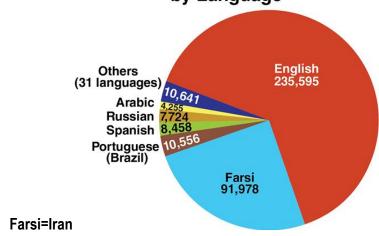
10/2021 NAWS received notice that the Small Business Administration (SBA) approved its forgiveness application on the first PPP loan in the amount of \$563,362. The remaining balance of \$113,378 was paid in full during the fiscal year ending on 6/2022. On 9/2022, NAWS received notice from the SBA their second PPP loan was forgiven entirely.
