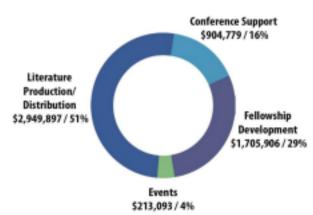

The ad-hoc committee held its first meeting online on Jan 23rd, 2023 at 6pm. We determined rather quickly that this had transitioned into a "Quad-Area" event, (rather than the previously named "Tri-Area").

Since American River was the only area that had officially formed the ad-hoc, this new committee struggled somewhat when it came to discussing or attempting to reach a consensus when addressing what the committee's primary focus should be. There were some members that felt the process of an ad-hoc was unnecessary and time consuming. Others wanted to "keep it simple" and simply proceed with putting on an event without delay. Ultimately there was a group consensus to proceed with evaluating and possibly adapting a set of guidelines (originally created by the SacFellowship for the purpose of co-chairing Unity day between 2 areas). No further recommendations were discussed.
