1) CAR (CONFERENCE AGENDA REPORT)

The CAR has been released and is available on the NAWS website (see link provided below). This report compiles motions, proposals, and topics for the WSC (World Service Conference) and provides financial, and historical background documentation for all of the motions that are being proposed. We have summarized below the 5 motions that we will be discussed and voted on at the 2026 WSC.

WORLD BOARD MOTIONS-

MOTION #1 To Approve the revised IP #21 Staying Clean in Isolation, (this would replace the old IP #21 The Loner)

MAKER: World Board

INTENT: To update this IP originally approved in 1986 with current Fellowship experience.

MOTION #2 Adopt the collaboratively created 2026–2029 NA World Services Strategic Plan contained in Addendum B MAKER: World Board

INTENT: To approve the results of the collaborative planning that began at WSC 2023 and continued with zonal and conference participant involvement throughout this cycle.

MOTION #3 To hold the World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous (WCNA) every 5 years, beginning in 2028. The location to be determined by the World Board (based on fiscal and geographic considerations)

MAKER: World Board

INTENT: To have guidelines for the World Convention (WCNA) that reflect the changing nature of large events worldwide and support the prudent use of Fellowship resources.

REGIONAL MOTIONS-

<u>MOTION #4</u> To direct the World Board to create a project plan for consideration at WSC 2029 to research and explore the opportunities and obstacles of providing booklength pieces of literature to the incarcerated, on tablets, in addition to the IPs and audio version of the Fifth Edition Basic Text that already exist on inmate tablets.

MAKER: Arizona Region Co-makers: Florida, Ohio, Northern California, Southern California, Sweden, UK, Utah **INTENT**: To give the Conference and Fellowship the ability to meaningfully discuss the opportunities and obstacles of making booklength pieces of literature available to the incarcerated on tablets.

<u>MOTION #5</u> To direct the World Board, to implement artificial intelligence (AI) interpretation solutions for WSC meetings (both in-person and virtual) to replace the current human live language interpretation.

MAKER: South Florida Region Co-makers: Iran, UK, Nepal

INTENT: To eliminate language barriers, ensuring that all voices are heard globally, enhancing our communication and time efficiency during business meetings. This initiative also aims to reduce the risk of human interpretation errors and potential absences during our sessions.

4) NCCNA (NORTHERN CALIFORNIA CONVENTION of NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS)

NCCNA 48 - After October's meeting, and the questions that came up about the Area bidding process for subcommittees, NCCNA did the research and reported the correct information for the RSC body. The NCCNA Vice Chair reported, "NCCNA can accept bids at any time for the next cycle once the new convention cycle has been opened, however, we cannot let an area know that they received the bid for a subcommittee until a minimum of 120 days prior to the convention." Therefore, the NCCNA committee had to rescind the motion that awarded SacFNA Program for NCCNA 48. NCCNA will be back in touch 120 days prior to the convention, (which will be in December this year) to announce the selection of any Area subcommittees. So, it is never too early to submit an Area bid. They are looking for three areas to step up and put a bid in for Program, Host or Registration.

BID Consideration- ARANA's guidelines read that we discuss the option to submit a bid (*or not*) in January. However, we now know we can submit a bid anytime. NCCNA is looking for three areas to step up and put a bid in for Program, Host or Registration. A couple of notes from the NCCNA handbook/guidelines:

- A) No Area may sponsor the same Subcommittee for two consecutive years.
- B) Multi-Area bids will be considered and are encouraged.
- C) NCCNA selects the Area Program, Host and Registration Subcommittees for its future convention after careful consideration of all relevant information outlined in the bid letters.
- D) Priority is given to those Areas which have not recently served as an NCCNA Subcommittee.

5) PR / H&I SHARING FORUM-

Our regional PR Chair reported last month "there were 6 out of 23 area PR committees represented in September... Although areas aren't required to send a representative, it makes sense that the area members want their PR committees to participate in a bi-monthly meeting that strengthens their PR committees by providing important information on what's working (and not working) in other areas in the Region." We have been asked to discuss this with our GSR's, and to see if you have any ideas of how to increase attendance at the regional PR/H&I Sharing Forum? Is the Sharing Forum something that our Area wants to contribute to?

DOs & DON'Ts of H & | Service

DO

- Emphasize that NA recovery is available to all addicts regardless of drugs used.
- Make directories of outside meetings available to residents.
- Start and end on time!
- Obey the dress code & exercise common sense.
- Adhere to each facility's rules and security regulations.
- Involve residents with the meeting, especially those in long term facilities.

DON'T

- Emphasize "using days" while sharing an NA message of recovery.
- Use profanity.
- Break another person's anonymity.
- Debate any issues involving facility rules, regulations, or other programs.
- Get involved in discussions on outside issues, including opinions regarding psych meds.
- Take messages or carry letters in or out of the facility
- Discuss any inmate's case or their guilt or innocence.

Note to Volunteers: An 11-page application is to be filled out and submitted. Listing arrest history is standard procedure. If you have an extensive arrest history, we will ask volunteers to write a reference letter and at times obtain their DOJ to be attached to the application.

Dress Code: It is always best to wear black clothing. No blue or green. No denim or blue jeans. We avoid color or clothing worn by inmates. No hats, shorts, sandals, halter tops, tank tops, no logos on shirts. Best not to have any wire in Bra's. No revealing clothing or opened toed shoes. The only items allowed in are your ID and car keys.
